During lockdown the parish SVP together with support from the Friendship Group and many individual parishioners have been supporting the elderly, vulnerable and those shielding at home or in residential care according to individual need: Doing shopping, arranging online deliveries, collecting and delivering prescriptions, supporting the Food Bank, providing essential support eg bedding, helping with electrical/plumbing problems, keeping in touch by phone, socially distanced visiting, leaving treats on the doorstep and conversing from a distance, providing materials to help fill the day eg books for children and craft materials, supporting access to streamed Masses on TV, computer or smart phone, supporting the bereaved, delivering the parish bulletin and Sunday Mass readings for those who can't access these on the website, circulating the Growing Old Gracefully/SVP Coronavirus booklet.
