Dear People of St Mary's,

Alma Corrie, known to many in the parish, died unexpectedly at 2am last Sunday 17th January. I thought you would like to know. Alma Corrie is the mother of Father George. He told me during the week that she loved coming to Knaresborough. I have assured Father George of our prayers for his mother, his father, and for the family.

Thank you those who got back to me with contact information for volunteers wanting to offer specific services at vaccination hubs/centres (see my message of last Sunday still on the website). This is responding to the Government's Coronavirus Places of Worship Taskforce, and their call for volunteers from faith communities to offer particular services at these hubs/centres, such as stewarding, and the skills of former healthcare workers, and many other roles.
